## Strategic Communications

- Conference Calls with Stakeholders
- Website information
- Periodic meetings/conferences
- Regular scheduled conference calls with industry (River Industry Executive Task Force, River Industry Action Committee Lower Mississippi River Committee, RIETF, Pacific Northwest Waterways Assoc, Gulf Intracoastal Canal Assoc, etc)

#### Lock Closure Information

- Scheduled Lock Closures:
  - ▶ Provide schedules at meetings/conferences
  - ▶ Discuss with stakeholders on teleconference
  - ▶ Broadcast Notice to Mariners
  - ▶ Personal calls to major shippers/key stakeholders
  - Coordination Groups include operators, USCG, Corps, and key stakeholders - All scheduled closures are scheduled in concert with these coordination groups





### Lock Closure Information

- Emergency/Un-scheduled Lock Closures:
  - Broadcast Notice to Mariners
  - Personal calls to key stakeholders/waterway commissions, major shippers/associations
  - ► Schedule Industry conference call ASAP





# Lock Closure Information

- Levels of Service:
  - Coordinate through Townhall-type meetings as far in advance is possible
  - ▶ Public Notice
  - ► Industry Meetings
  - ► State/Local Government Notification





## Future Improvements to Lock Closure Information

- Proactive involvement with industry stakeholders well in advance of scheduling closure dates and durations.
- Ensure communication plans identify all interested stakeholders.
- Coordination across the IMTS to minimize impacts to navigation, e.g. concurrent closures on same waterway – staggered closures on alternative waterways.
- Work with industry groups (RIETF, LOMRC, PNWA, RIAC, etc. to focus on future closures.
- New Corps Notice to Navigation Interests web site.
