## Vision

USACE prioritizes public involvement within Civil Works, Military, Operations, Regulatory and Readiness mission areas in order to achieve sustainable project solutions, better meet schedules and cost limitations, and reduce the risk of controversy and litigation.

## Mission

Public Involvement Specialists improve USACE's capacity to engage the public and agency partners at the county, state and federal levels. PI Specialists specifically support the stakeholder engagement components of SMART Planning, USACE Infrastructure Strategy and Watershed-informed Budgeting.

## Role

Public Involvement Specialists serve as internal consultants within the Districts/Division for Civil Works, Military Programs, Regulatory and Readiness missions to enhance two-way communication and collaborative problem solving with stakeholders. Activities include assessing the need, timing and approach to public engagement, developing public involvement plans, designing effective public involvement forums, completing public involvement activities, and supporting public involvement in current [Flood Risk Management Pilots](#). Specialists disseminate public involvement best practices in their district and address needs for training and technical assistance. They advocate for the value of meaningful public involvement and mentor colleagues in public involvement techniques. Early and strategic public involvement helps achieve sustainable solutions and better meet project schedules and costs. Public Involvement also improves USACE products and reduces the risk of controversy and litigation.

The cadre of Public Involvement Specialists fosters cross-MSC and cross-district exchanges relating to USACE public involvement. The specialists participate in monthly calls organized around peer coaching for their district projects and spend time building their public involvement skills. Specialists not already in Public Affairs coordinate their activities closely with the PA Office.

## Background

In FY14, the National Flood Risk Management Program and the Conflict Resolution and Public Participation Center of Expertise are sponsoring 12 Public Involvement Specialists. The concept of a cadre of Public Involvement experts is a recommendation from a post-Katrina program "Actions for Change" calling for USACE to improve public involvement in flood risk management. Some districts have community outreach specialists but this is not consistent across the Corps. Public involvement demands are different from district to district, as is the structure of the USACE organization. For these reasons, the implementation of the Public Involvement Specialists program varies from district to district and across divisions.
