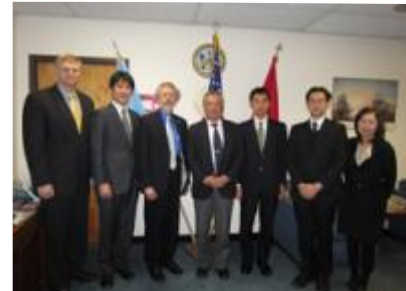

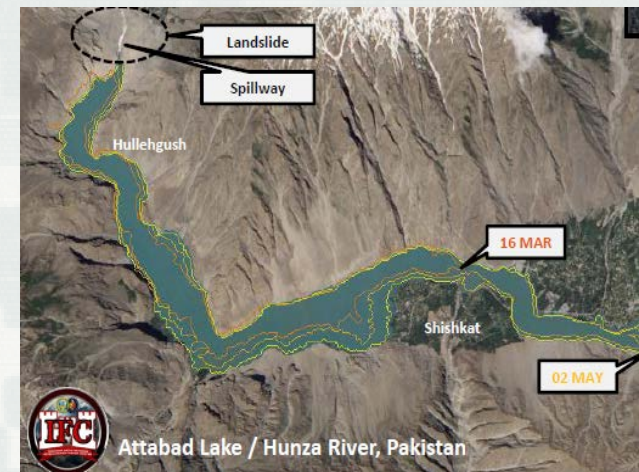

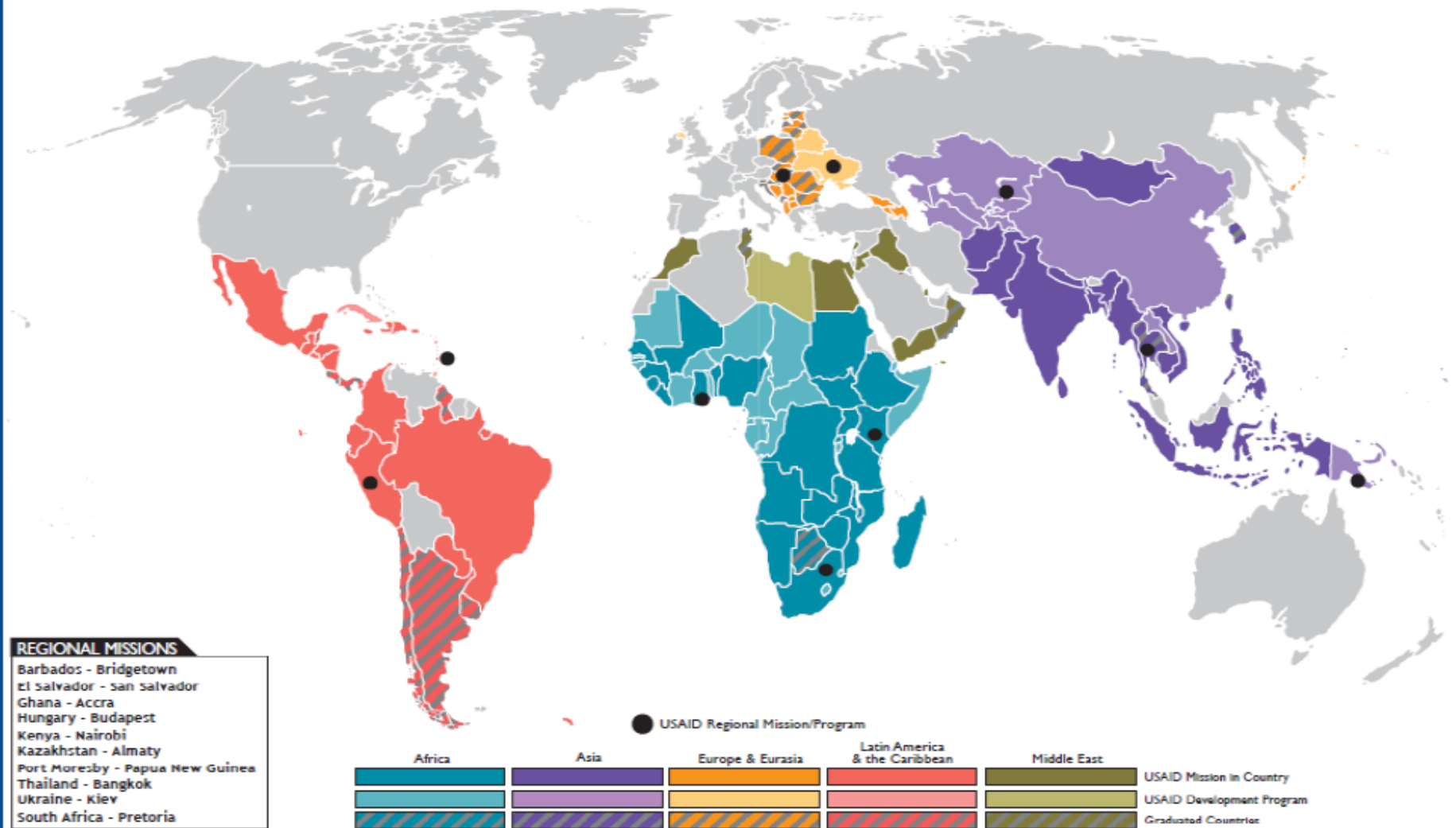
- Interagency mechanism to leverage water resources experts

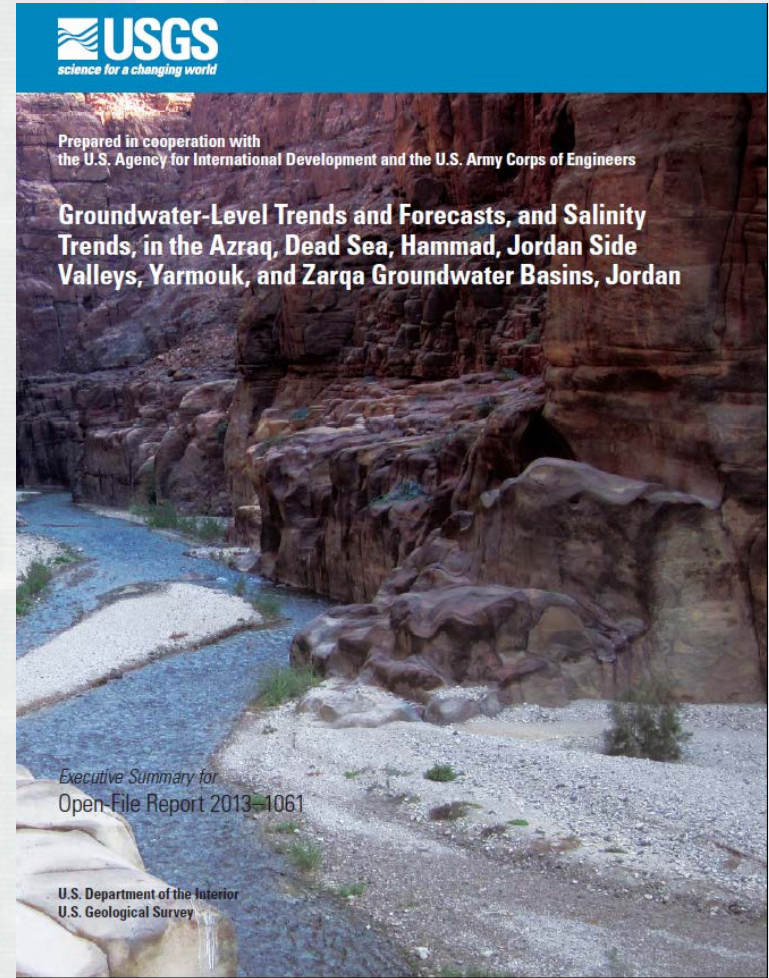
