Purpose: The study is now focused on identifying how federal agencies can collaborate and integrate their shore management programs to improve program and service efficiencies and effectiveness to non-Federal agencies, which are involved with shore management, for the purposes of reducing the impact of coastal hazards and improving community resilience.

Objective: WRDA 1999, Section 215(c) calls for the Corps of Engineers to prepare a report for Congress recommending the appropriate level of federal and non-federal participation in shore protection and the use of a systems approach to sand management. The report will also describe the extent of, and economic and environmental effects caused by, erosion and accretion along the shores of the U.S; the causes of such erosion and accretion; the systematic movement of sand along U.S. shores; and Federal, State, and local government resources committed to restore and renourish shores.
