Planners Core Curriculum (2010)

Purpose: The Planners Core Curriculum (PCC) is a series of training courses created or modified to meet specific needs of new Corps planners. It is part of the Planning Excellence Program designed to promote and reenergize planning capability in the Corps of Engineers. The basic courses are: -Civil Works Orientation -Introduction to Planning -Planning, Principles and Procedures -Plan Formulation Workshop -Economic Analysis for Water Resources Planning -Environmental Analysis for Water Resources Planning -Hydrologic Engineering for Planners -Consensus Building for Water Resources Planning For three years, these courses were presented in MSC settings, with no tuition charged. Districts were encouraged to send students. The initial training rounds have been accomplished. The courses have now been turned over to Huntsville and PROSPECT.

Objective: The objective is to promote planning capability. To only permit planners to take one course per year would not serve that purpose. FY05 was the last year of the PCC "free" offerings. The courses are officially listed as PROSPECT, though management remains in IWR.

Benefits: There are 7 Core Curriculum Planning Courses. Each of these courses are structured to meet specific needs of new Corps planners. This will promote and reenergize planning capability in the Corps of Engineers.
