2. Identify YOUR Issue according to the following criteria and read the appropriate pdfs under Interest Groups Background

If you have an even year and even numbered month birth date, select between:

- Recreational Boating & Tourism
- Commercial Navigation

If you have an even year and odd numbered month birth date, select between:

- Environment
- Municipal and Industrial Water Uses

If you have an odd year and even numbered month birth date, select between:

- Hydropower
- Coastal - Lake Ontario and Upper St. Lawrence River

If you have an odd year and odd numbered month birth date, select between:

- Coastal - Lower St. Lawrence River
- Aboriginal Issues

3. Plan Results- Overall Plan Results. Navigate through each of the summary evaluation tables, selecting different options for the tables to see how they change with different inputs/scenarios. Then navigate through the other results and displays. Note which of the alternative plans positively or negatively impact your interests.

4. Levels & Flows – 101 Year Supply Sequences

Navigate through each of the hyperlinks and view the outputs when you select different criteria. Note your observations.

5. Based on your observations from the reports and model outputs, identify your preferred alternative.

6. Select an interest **of your choice** and view the model outputs to identify your preferred alternative for that interest. Record your observations and any differences as you view the outputs from a different perspective.
