PRIMARY OUTCOME & CHALLENGES

- Enhanced readiness for future wildfire events through hands-on, scenario-based planning exercises.
- Improved interagency tactical coordination, post-fire recovery strategies, and seasonal preparation activities.
- Valuable lessons learned from real-world case studies (e.g., 2016 Nimitz Hill and Route 17 wildfires).
- Actionable next steps identified, including restoration planning, public outreach, supply procurement, and training opportunities.
- High participant engagement demonstrated strong local interest in collaborative wildfire response and resilience-building.
